District working with Presbyterian Church to provide programming on mental health Posted school calendar is accurate, but one additional day will be off for election once determined by State
Vape Detectors at BHS have been successful. District looking for additional funding to help put this in all bathrooms (have 2, need 10 more. Cost approximately \$1,000/ea. Can the PTG help support? (see notes under Surplus section for further discussion)
